Script scenario P4S19Y2: Architecture in Europe Part 3. The Architecture from the Contemporary age to the Mid-20<sup>th</sup> century.

The entire scenario is divided into three parts. Part 1: Introduction. The Classical Architecture (P4S17Y2). Part 2: Architecture from the fall of the Roman Empire to the Contemporary age (P4S18Y2). Part 3: Architecture from the contemporary age to the Mid-20th century. (P4S19Y2)

The scenario P4S19Y2 will need 7 hours (including the Kandinsky construction). Teacher could adapt the activities (order and number) according to the deeper study of the scenario. Some activities could be done and not others (for example, I propose to do at home some activities, it is optional). The same for the activities proposed to do at home (some of them

scale-up activities). Activities can be done in groups (pairs (\$\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} ) or individual (\$\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} ).

In case teacher wants to follow the entire scenario, the activities proposed for each session will be the below:

### 1st teaching period

Class organisation: The entire group (if read in pairs or individually).

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain the text "The Neoclassicism" or students to read. Teacher solves doubts about the text. Possible discussions.

Activity number: Activity 14: "What is the name of this neoclassical constructions?"

Time: 5'

Type of activity: Matching activity.

Class organisation: In pairs (Optional individually).

Actions/Tasks: Students have to match images with the correct word.

#### 4th Activity:

Type of activity: Reading (students)/explaining (teacher) activity. Watching a video.

Class organisation: The entire group (if read in pairs or individually).

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain (or students read) the text "The architecture between the 19th and the 20th centuries. The Modernism". Solving doubts. Possible discussion. Watch the video (The entire group, in pairs or individually) "The World's Oldest Construction Project. Sagrada Familia" could help students to understand better the contents. Solving doubts.

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should summarize the things done during the day. Solving doubts. Possible

discussion.

Activity number: Activity 15: "Do you know any scene from the Bible that appears in the Sagrada Familia?".

Time: 20'.

Type of activity: Searching on the net and writing activity.

Class organisation: In pairs (optional individually).

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain the activity 15. Students have to answer the proposed question.

#### 2nd Activity:

Activity number: Activity 16: "Do you know that Antoni Gaudi was a very religious man?".

Time: 10'.

Type of activity: Searching on the net and writing activity.

Class organisation: In pairs (optional individually).

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain the activity 16. Students have to answer the proposed question.

Type of activity: Wiki activity.

Class organisation: In pairs (optional individually).

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain how to do the activity 21. Each group should prepare one of the architectural styles proposed in the wiki. Students can choose the style or teacher could assign each style to a group in order to prepare a wiki with different architectural styles. Students can follow the examples done in the activity. The next day, each group should explain to the partners the construction done by them. Students assess the work done by their partners. The activity could be finished at home.

Type of activity: Speaking activity + Watching videos.

Class organisation: The entire group.

Actions/Tasks: Teacher should explain the final project. Videos proposed could be watched to help the students. Students have to build a construction based in a Kandinsky picture. Some material to build geometrical constructions are done. They have to use as recycled materials as possible. Creativity will be considered. Follow the instructions that appear in the text. Students have to decide the Kandinsky picture they want to build in 3D. Some work can be done at home.
