invoice	a form describing the goods or services sold, the quantity, and the price

inequality	the unfair situation in society when some people have more opportunities, money, etc. than other people
crackdown on	severe action taken to restrict the activities of criminals or of people opposed to the government or somebody in authority
corruption	dishonest or illegal actions
revenue	incoming money

transparency	the unfair situation in society when some people have more opportunities, money, etc. than other people
fundamental	basic; primary; essential
legally binding	something that must be obeyed because it is accepted in law.
survival	the ability to continue living
negligence	failure to take proper care in doing something
potential	ability to develop, achieve, or succeed
abuse	physical or emotional harm to someone
exploitation	an act that exploits or victimizes someone (treats them unfairly)
entail	to include as a necessary step
child labour	the use of children in industry or business, especially when illegal or considered inhumane.
assemble	to gather with one another in order to express views on public matters
conflict	a struggle between opposing forces
ensure	to make sure or certain
discrimination	behaving differently, usually unfairly, toward the members of a group.

mobilize	to coordinate; to move people or things around for a purpose
fundamental	basic and important
integration	the act of uniting or bringing together, especially people of different races
dignity	the state or quality of being worthy of honor or respect
trafficking	deal or trade in something illegal
convention	a large formal meeting of people who do a particular job or have a similar interest, or a large meeting for a political party
