## Group 2: Scenario 2



Maria, a 2<sup>nd</sup>-grade high school student, dated Kostas, a 3<sup>rd</sup>-grade high school student, of the same school, for about 3 months. In the last month, Costas kept asking her questions, such as: why she did not pick up the phone immediately, why

she had so many friends on Facebook, why she talked during breaks with her classmates, etc. Maria tried not to pay too much attention to his questions, but later Kostas started to become more and more pressing. He spoke badly to her and insulted her using crude words in front of everyone. Once he even slapped her on the face when he saw her talking to her friends. He told her that he did all this because he was very much in love with her and it was reasonable for him to be jealous.

## Group 3: Scenario 3

In the first month everything was perfect. He then started pressing her to have sex, but Eleni constantly refused. At one point she asked him to break up and he, after pushing her, threatened to take revenge on her. The next day, he spread rumours throughout the school that they had sex and at the same time wrote vulgar / sexist comments about Eleni on the wall of the school toilet. Her friends stopped hanging out with her because they considered her immoral.

Some of the boys looked at her and laughed, calling her "easy".

## Group 4: Scenario 4



14-year-old George is a very good student and mild-mannered. Every day, however. his classmates teased him about his appearance. Then they started calling him gay in the courtyard and making obscene gestures. One day he was pushed to the toilet, his pants were taken off

and he was photographed. They then sent his photo electronically to all the students at the school along with his phone. During the breaks, he never left the classroom, because the rest of his classmates looked at him strangely, laughed at him and asked him questions, e.g. what it is like to be a gay, if his parents knew it etc.
