WHAT IS MEANT BY SCHOOL DROPOUT?

An act or case of waiver of

a student who retires before completing a training course, or who dropsout of school before or after reaching the legal age to do so.

CAUSES

Social condition

Family environment

Labor emigration from poor countries that increasingly affect students, who either follow their parents or are left to relatives who deal only superficially with the school situation of children

Material difficulties

The educational model offered by parents or older siblings who are perhaps more influential

Disorganization of the family that entails material difficulties

Juvenile delinquency

CAUSES

Entering the labor market

Low confidence in education

Problems faced by children

Educational practices perceived by students as unfair, frustrating, incompatible,

Lack of security in some areas

Non-involvement in school and vocational guidance,

CAUSES

Insufficient integration in the classroom

Group pressure

School overload

Poor student-teacher communication

Subjective evaluation

Fear of evaluation

Conflict with colleagues

CONSEQUENCES

The implications of early school leaving are far-reaching and affect economic, social and health outcomes throughout life.

At the individual level, there are probably lower economic and employment prospects, lower incomes for life and higher rates of poverty and unemployment. As a result of lifelong learning, the difference in income between a person who dropped out of school and a person with high school credentials is huge and is m more likely to engage people in antisocial behavior, including violent, property and drug offenses.

Finally, early school leaving risks developing poor mental and physical health, including depression and chronic health conditions Taken together, the long-term prospects for early school leaving are relatively unpleasant

The consequences of early school leaving severely affect societies.

PREVENTION OF SCHOOL DROPOUT

By facilitating access to education from an early age

Reducing the number of students with poor performance and unmotivated absences and school recovery through "second chance" programs

Integrating students at risk of dropping out of education and maintaining them in the school system

Increasing teacher accountability

Reintegration of abandoned students

Monitoring the state of the system to prevent early abandonment

Periodic identification of changes in school dropout factors

PREVENTION OF SCHOOL DROPOUT

Existence of government programs aimed at preventing school dropout

Existence of initiated programs aimed at reducing or eradicating the phenomenon of school dropout

Promoting and encouraging research in the field of preventing and combating this phenomenon

Increasing the responsibility of parents or legal guardians of students
