1st Teaching period (50 minutes)

(before the beginning of the first teaching period, students are asked to complete the first two columns on a KWL chart with about what they know and what would they like to know about migration in the contemporary world.)

1st Activity

Time: 25'

Type of activity: powerpoint presentation

Class organisation: whole class

Actions/Tasks: The teacher presents to the students a powerpoint that helps them to discover what migration means, what are its main causes and how the two world wars influenced the phenomenon of contemporary migrations. The teacher and students discuss migration, and students write down new information in notebooks.

2nd Activity

Time: 20'

Type of activity: video projection

Class organisation: whole class,

Actiond/ Tasks: The teacher presents the students with a video with which the students discover the differences between migrant, emigrant and immigrant. Students write the new information in notebooks

Type of activity: debate

Class organisation: team work

Actions/Tasks: The teacher divides the students into 2 groups and asks the students to debate. Who is really a "citizen" of a country: the one who was born a citizen of that country or the one who wanted and strived to become a member of that state? One group will support one point of view and the other another point of view.
