WOMEN WHO HAVE CHANGED HISTORY

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Student aged 13-14.

Language level: Language level: A2 (based on the common European framework reference for languages)

Duration: 3 teaching periods

FIRST CLASS

The first activity

Time: 15 minutes

Type of activity: conversation

Class organization: individual work

Activity: The teacher presents in contrast two images, a woman in the Middle Ages and a modern woman. (Annex 1)

She asks students to identify the differences between the two women in a 5-line text.

The second activity:

Time: 35 minutes

Type of activity: presentation of the status of women in society.

Class organization: individual work

Activity: The teacher uses a power point presentation to highlight the different status of women in various times and places in the world.

Throughout history, women have struggled for equality and gained political and civil rights gradually. Throughout history, however, the physical differences between them have always resulted in inequalities and domination of the stronger over the weak.

Students have 10 minutes to complete the task of identifying 5 ways to improve the status of women today.

SECOND CLASS

First activity:

Time: 15 minutes

Type of activity: presentation of famous women who changed the world

Class organization: working in groups

Activity: the teacher introduces the student, based on videos, of how women managed to change the world.

The second activity:

Time: 35 minutes

Type of activity: identification

Class organization: team work

Carrying out the activity: The teacher divides the class into three groups. Each group receives a different task. Students have 20 minutes to complete the task and then present the final result to the class.

Group 1: Famous Female Pharaohs and Queens of Ancient Egypt

THIRD CLASS

First activity:

Time: 15 minutes

Activity type: 13 women who changed the history of the world and the lives of men through science.

Class organization: individual work

Activity: The teacher presents the students with pictures of the 13 women who changed the history of the world and the lives of men through science.

The second activity:

Time: 35 minutes

Type of activity: EXHIBITION OF THE FAMOUS WOMEN IN THE WORLD

Class organization: individual work

Activity:. The teacher with the help of students organizes in the classroom or in the school's library an exhibition dedicated to the famous women of the world who have contributed to the development of mankind.
